## James T. Grady

James T. Grady was the managing editor of the American Chemical Society's News Service from 1923 until 1948. He was credited with having a significant impact on the communication of and the development of public appreciation of science and the James T. Grady Medal was established in his honour.

## James H. Stack

James H. Stack was first assistant managing editor to Grady and later succeeded him as managing editor in 1948. In 1960 he was selected to head the new division of Public, Professional and Member Relations, eventually retiring in 1973. His name was added to the James T. Grady Award in 1984.
